

Fri, July 22 - Sun, August 21, 2022 Echo Food and art event 2022, TOMORROW FIELD

We are pleased to announce that we will be holding an exhibition "Echo - Food and art event 2022, TOMORROW FIELD" in the northern part of Kyoto, Kyotango area from July 22 to August 21, 2022. In the fall of 2021, at the Taiza Studio, which was completed in the Kyotango, an attempt to return new values from the local climate and its beauty started with food and art professionals. Since then, we have been developing various activities to deepen our ties with the local community.

In this project, we will hold three special exhibitions stemmed from three themes and three attempts (festival, market and library) to propose future life through the climate, history and industry of the land. In [Special Exhibition I] at Takeno Shrine, which has a history of more than 2000 years, a place of prayer, a *Yashiro* (ritual house) and a *Hokora* (small shrine) will be created under the theme of "Pray" which is the source of art and creation. In [Special Exhibition], we will propose the "future life" of crafts and art rooted in the Japanese climate from a composite artistic approach at the Taiza Studio. At Kinosaki Onsen Mikiya, a hot spring inn that has nurtured culture for 300 years since its inauguration, we will introduce "The Link of Land" where the history and culture of architecture and contemporary art are connected as [Special Exhibition III.]

During the exhibition period, three events [Food Festival], [Market] and [Library] will take place at Takano Shrine. Through [Food Festival], architect, agricultural history researcher and chefs will discover the food culture that lives in this area and find the joy of eating by working together. Crafts, which has been inherited in Kyotango, are made into works from a contemporary perspective, exhibited and marketed at [Market] and, visitors can learn deeply the history, culture and charm of the land at [Library.]

In the process of gathering talents of various occupations involved in the creative field, generating a place of creation while interrelating with each other, and interacting with visitors, there is a possibility that mutual hearts will resonate and awaken beauty.

We hope you enjoy experiencing the creativity rippling like waves on the surface of water, and the beauty that echoes across all boundaries in summer in Kyotango.


